Mr. Chairman and members of the IOC Programme Commission,

It is with great pride that we present to you our response to the 2016 Olympic Programme Review. The entire world of golf is united behind our effort. We are one sport and one team, sharing a single voice with one objective - to return golf to the Olympic Programme. The International Golf Committee created the Olympic Golf Committee, which is composed of the world's seven leading golf organisations - the Ladies' Professional Golf Association, the Masters Tournament, the PGA European Tour, the PGA of America, the PGA TOUR, The R&A and the United States Golf Association.
